A Letter From Mike



I remember coming to Grace Chapel for the first time in 2004. We felt so loved and welcomed that Grace instantly became a home for us. Home is where you feel like you're part of a family and belong to something special. Just like we felt fourteen years ago, we continue to hear people say over and over again, "Grace just feels like home".

This fall Grace Chapel celebrates its 20th anniversary as a family of faith. We are in an exciting season in the life of our church where the Spirit of God is moving in our midst with great things happening in our lives together and in our local community. More people than ever before are attending, growing, serving, and giving, and people are being sent out on mission teams all across the world. While God has had us in a season of great impact, He is leading us into a season of greater outreach and spiritual growth.

This past year was marked by the transition out of our previous facility and into Meridian Creek Middle School. Not knowing where we would meet created an opportunity to seek the Lord together and trust Him with our future. Even though it was a time of uncertainty,

it was a time of deep presence and of God's faithful provision. As we learned how to worship in our "wilderness" He blessed us with both a temporary home and a future, permanent home. God has provided an opportunity for us to continue making a difference for His Kingdom.

In June 2018 we had the incredible opportunity to purchase a building in Wilsonville on the I-5 corridor that will become our future home. As much as it is a blessing to meet in the middle school, we only have a temporary agreement with the school district. Our new building will not only be a permanent home where we can gather as a church family but will serve as a Kingdom outpost in our area.

When Jesus talked about the Kingdom it was more than just a message, it was a message with power to transform lives. He was introducing a new reality where the last became first and the poor became rich, where the outcast became the guest of honor and the lost became found. When Jesus envisioned the church he envisioned more than church meetings and gatherings; he dreamed of people who would live

for the kingdom by experiencing and expressing the essence of Jesus. This is what we dream of for our church. With this new church building we envision a kingdom presence in our region that will bless the entire community by ministering to more people, meeting more needs, and providing shared space that can bless others all week long. For this reason we are launching a two-year generosity initiative called "For The Kingdom."

I invite you to join us in praying about how you can be involved. My hope is that God would unite us like never before. I'm excited about the journey God will take us on together!

Prayer & Humility:




Stepping into the margins is more than awareness or advocacy, its about associating, sharing life, and rescuing those who have been ignored and victimized by this cruel world. We share love in practical ways and share the gospel boldly in order to heal the sick and set the captives free.

Leveraging

All That We Have:

Leveraging all that we have for God's greater purpose is about realizing that all we have has been entrusted to us by God so we can play a part in his redemptive story for this world and my life.

Breathing

The Word In & Through Us:

The Bible is more than a how-to, self - help book. Breathing God's Word is about taking a deep breath and inhaling all that He desires for us to absorb. At the same time, His Word is not intended to just remain in us but that we would exhale and share His message to those around us.

Identifying

Baptism & Communion:

Being a follower of Jesus means being a part of something bigger than our individual selves. Baptism and communion are sacred experiences that represent both the individual inward commitment to a personal relationship with Jesus and the corporate outward declaration of being connected to a local community of Christ followers—the local church.

WHAT IS FOR THE KINGDOM ABOUT?

The Bible tells us that as Jesus traveled from one place of worship to another, “[The] Kingdom was his theme”. Then, as word spread through the entire region, “People brought anybody with an ailment, whether mental, emotional, or physical. Jesus healed them, one and all. More and more people came, the momentum gathering” (Matthew 4:23-25 MSG). “For The Kingdom” is about aligning ourselves with this theme and mission of Jesus. We are called to bring the values of the kingdom to intersect with the brokenness of our world.

A Multi-Purpose Space

Grace Chapel started with a vision to “Give Itself Away”. We want every resource we have, including our

meeting space, to be used to benefit the surrounding community, not just Grace Chapel and we are excited to finally have a permanent facility to call “home”. As we have seen with our Heart of the City outreach center, having a permanent meeting place in our community will make it possible to expand how we serve the community so that more people than ever before will come to “Experience and Express the essence of Jesus”!

Plans are underway to construct a 38,000 square foot space. This will involve renovating an existing two-story, 20,000 square foot building and adding to it a 18,000 square foot lobby and multi-purpose worship space, doubling as a sports court.

We Believe This Facility Will Accomplish These Things:

- 1.** *More people will hear the gospel and experience the love of Jesus*
- 2.** *It will enhance the experience for teens and children within our church and city*
- 3.** *It will give our ministries and our city multi-purpose spaces for gatherings*
- 4.** *It will provide a permanent and visible presence in our region*
- 5.** *It will create more accessibility for more people to experience our weekend gatherings*

We believe that if each of us decides to fully engage, then we will see God move in incredible and unexpected ways. Participation in Groups and serving will increase, ministries will excel, our impact locally and globally will skyrocket, and giving will multiply exponentially. As a result, people will find Jesus, hurting people will be cared for, relationships will be restored, and communities will be transformed. In all of this our desire is that more people than ever before will come to “Experience and Express the essence of Jesus!”

As a church, we do everything we can to support students on this journey and equip them for what God has in store for their lives.




Worship And Community


The name of our church, “Grace”, was not a coincidence in how it relates to generosity. When followers of Jesus soak in the magnificence of God’s grace, it drives us toward a lifestyle of justice.

When we fully understand what motivates us to participate in justice work, we realize it is rooted in the gospel of Jesus Christ, who out of his grace, generously gave himself away so that we can experience what is wrong in our lives being made right. The beautiful irony is that as we participate in God’s redemptive work of justice and compassion in our neighborhoods, cities, and world, we become transformed in the process. Some of

the most beautiful, inspiring life change has taken place in our own hearts and lives as we partner in justice work. That is why we desire to experience and express the essence of Jesus Christ by stepping into the vulnerable, marginalized, and risky places of injustice domestically and internationally.

Domestic Mission

God has called us to make an impact domestically. We believe that God has given us favor with the surrounding community and an ability to make a difference in Wilsonville and the Greater Portland area. Through our partnership with Heart of City and many other partners (City Team, DHS:Foster Kid boxes, Coffee Creek Correctional Bags, Local Schools: Joy Drive, Royal Family Kids Camp, Angel Tree, etc) the Kingdom of God invades our region through the work of justice and compassion. These are just a few of the ways the people of Grace Chapel take their faith out into the region showing God’s love in a tangible and supernatural way.





Domestic Mission

Since God has placed Grace Chapel in Wilsonville and the South Metro area, we believe our mission starts here and extends from here to the world.

Wilsonville YoungLife

We want every High School and Middle School student to have the opportunity to hear and respond to the Gospel. Our partnership with Younglife started in 2001 with this goal in mind.

Foster Parent Night Out

This monthly event provides a night of fun for Clackamas County foster kids and a night of respite for their foster parents.

Blood Drive

We provide the opportunity to donate blood to serve those who are hurting in our community and beyond.

Welcome Boxes

This is an ongoing ministry where Grace Chapel partners with Embrace Oregon to provide a box of necessities and goodies to give to children entering the foster system.

Rummage Sale

The Wilsonville Community Rummage Sale is an event that supports schools and local non-profits for the purpose of fighting hunger and poverty in our community.

Serve the School

This is an event that helps our Wilsonville school district by completing outdoor work projects at every school campus in the city.

Joy Drive

This is an Advent season ministry that provides winter clothing and other gifts for children in our Wilsonville schools.

Royal Family Kids Camp Birthday Party

This ministry provides a birthday party and gifts for all the foster children that attend Royal Family Kids Camp.

Angel Tree

This is an Advent season ministry provided by the partnership between Prison Fellowship and local churches, helping relationships between inmates and their families by providing gifts.

CityTeam Christmas Party

Every year we provide a Christmas party and gifts to bless those who are actively involved in the long-term recovery program at CityTeam Portland.





International Mission

The impact Grace Chapel makes stretches across the world. Over the years we have developed strategic relationships with partner organizations.

From our kids home in Rwanda, to the projects and people we support through Living Water International, to international disaster relief work, the difference Grace Chapel is making has never been more significant!

Africa New Life

Africa New Life exists to transform lives and communities through Preaching the Gospel of Jesus Christ and Acts of Compassion.

Since 2001, Africa New Life has shared the Gospel using two hands: the hand of compassion and the hand of evangelism. Our goal is to see lives transformed through meeting basic needs, to give hope for the future for those living in poverty in Rwanda, and to share the freedom and hope found in Christ. At the heart of our model for breaking cycles of poverty is educational sponsorship. With a high school education, or a vocational equivalent, children in Rwanda have hope for the future.

Our partnership with Africa New Life Ministries started in 2005 and since that time, Grace Chapel has

been responsible for hundreds and hundreds of sponsored kids, funding building projects and opening one of Africa New Life's first children's homes.

Living Water International

Grace has sent teams of people to help install clean water wells, raised money through Golf Tournaments, 5k races and has had members supporting through their businesses. Just this year, Grace Chapel provided the resources for 11 India projects. By faithfully partnering with Living Water over the past 11 years, Grace Chapel is considered a top 75 donor and we are in the top 15 churches who support Living Water.

Living Water International exists to demonstrate the love of God by helping communities acquire desperately-needed clean water through the implementation of participatory, community-based water, sanitation and hygiene solutions in 17 developing countries across Latin America and the Caribbean, Africa and Asia. The organization has completed more than 19,000 water projects as part

of its ongoing commitment to provide water, for life, in Jesus' name.

Living Water's end goal is to see holistic behavior change by supporting the local church and equipping local people to serve their own communities.

Remember Nhu

One of Grace Chapel's newest partners is a foundation whose single focus is ending sex slavery through prevention. Remember Nhu does this in the context of Homes of Refuge to give safety to both boys and girls helping them to thrive physically, educationally, emotionally and spiritually.

HEART OF THE CITY

*Loving And Serving The Whole Person
And The Whole Community*

Heart of the City, a mission of Grace Chapel, is a place for partnering non-profits and other organizations to reside, share meeting space, and join hands in the effort to maximize each others' work toward maximum impact for the Wilsonville community as well as Clackamas County, the greater Portland area and even throughout the world.

Heart of City allows a holistic approach to caring for people. We are eternal beings with three primary parts: our soul (or spirit), our mind, and our body. Each part needs to be nourished and cared for, and each part feeds the others; they are interdependent. We need to collectively listen to, care for, and exercise our soul, our mind, and our body.

In response to needs of our community and our call to serve both the whole person and the whole community, Grace Chapel founded Heart of the City. This mission, through a shared facility and support system, will meet its purpose through connecting people, promoting health and wellness, expressing compassion and care, and providing personal development by maximizing resources via strategic partners.



What is Heart Of The City About?

Heart of the City is dedicated to the well-being of the community of Wilsonville and beyond.

A holistic approach to caring for people.

Connecting People

Every city is made up of many neighborhoods; thriving cities, in particular, are made up of healthy neighborhoods. All too often, neighborhoods can be filled with strangers instead of neighbors.

Heart of the City seeks to provide a safe place for relationships to foster and grow. Our goal is that this space will provide an accessible community gathering place for activities, meeting spots

and life enhancing programs that will foster connections with friends and families.

Heart of the City will create an ethos of strengthening and uniting the community by bringing together its diverse, multi-generational and ethnic expressions.

Health and Wellness

We believe in a holistic approach to wellness. The importance of a person's interior and exterior health. Through sports, fitness, and recreation, these initiatives help develop a positive use of leisure time and reduction of stress. Athletics and recreation can enhance health and wellness

by increasing daily physical activity, teaching good nutrition, developing healthy relationships, learning social and interpersonal skills, and providing family centered activities.

Compassion and Care

Heart of the City serves as a hub of social responsibility for those in need. Whether hunger and poverty or abuse and recovery, Heart of the City is created in response to social challenges and functions as a lifeline in our city and to communities around the world. We understand the challenges that keep individuals from reaching their full potential. We respond with services and support that help people to



be self-reliant and productive contributors to the community, while maintaining dignity and respect. We provide support through services focused on critical needs such as a food distribution, medical clinics, child welfare, advocacy, addiction recovery, grief care, clothing, senior assistance, and benevolent resourcing.

In addition, Heart of the City hosts a Counseling Center which provides a caring environment for spiritual, mental and emotional well-being. Services include support for those struggling with life issues, emotional trauma, substance abuse, behavioral problems, divorce recovery, as well as marriage and parenting

workshops.

Personal Development

We believe that every person carries intrinsic value and has the potential for great things. We also believe the values and skills learned early on are vital building blocks for life. Living and thriving requires the opportunity to learn and grow in basic skills of life. Heart of the City will seek to provide development programs, counseling services, transitional housing and educational opportunities including: adult basic education modules (math, reading, writing, social studies, spelling, vocabulary development), GED preparation, and college preparation assistance. It will also

offer computer literacy, career employment skills education, resume writing, job search, and job training to help prepare individuals for the increasingly vigorous task of obtaining employment.

A New Church in Rwanda | Africa New Life

We have an amazing opportunity with one of our longest partners to build a church in Rwanda. We desire to not just build something for ourselves in Wilsonville, but to build a church for our brothers and sisters in Rwanda who are in desperate need. The need for churches in Rwanda is very high. Earlier this year, over 7,000 churches were closed because the government deemed them structurally unsafe. The church we are building will be a focal point of the community. This new church building will be a place of worship multiple times a week, it will be a gathering and meeting center for the community, and it will include the sponsorship offices for the children in their community. Our prayer is that through this local church, the Great Commission of making disciples will be unleashed!

More Wells that Lead to Jesus | Living Water International

The impact of a clean water well in a community that does not have access to clean water is nothing less than amazing. We are committing resources to Living Water International (LWI) to build more wells which will lead people to Jesus. Through our partnership with LWI, we will be partnering with local churches in other countries to provide a basic humanitarian need, care for the community, and give people a chance to hear the message of Jesus.

Resources to love those in need | Heart of the City

Heart of the City ("HOC") is making a difference in the Wilsonville and South Metro area. We are growing every month and are seeing more and more people cared for and loved. The growth of Heart of the City is out pacing the resources and donations it is receiving. 



WHAT IS A ONE FUND?

Whether you have never given to Grace Chapel before or you already give regularly, everyone has the opportunity to listen for God's direction and participate.



We are excited to introduce One Fund. In the past we have asked people to give to special projects in addition to tithes/offering. During this two year period, we will not have separate funds. Instead, every aspect of Grace Chapel will be included in One Fund. One Fund will fully resource the ministry, mission and projects of Grace Chapel as a church, in the community, and in the world.

We are asking everyone to do two things:

- 1) Pray about your level of involvement
- 2) Come to a decision about your financial commitment to the overall mission of Grace Chapel for the next two years

Consistent Giver


